

Rotary Meet: Girls Lead Record Smashing

It was a day for records Saturday at the Camarillo Rotary Club track meet as eight old records were broken and record marks were established in each of 30 events run in the meet for the first time.

Over 400 boys and girls in the fifth, sixth, seventh and eighth grades from eight local schools ruled proceedings at the annual events, and the girls topped the day's action scoring 15 records in a total of 16 events.

The girls actually broke seven of eight old records and set marks in eight new events, but the boys were only able to break one out of 11 old records while setting marks in 22 first-time events.

The only old mark the girls did not erase Saturday was in the seventh grade relay where Los Altos School's number one team dropped a baton on the last leg and fell out of the race.

The only old record erased by the boys yesterday came on a 19-foot, 6-inch effort by Mesa's Noldy Van Sommeren in the class A broad jump to erase the old mark of 18-feet, 8-inches.

The meet this year was run on an individual basis and not tally of team scoring was kept. The boys last year competed in the only two divisions, but this year were spread out through six classes, A through F. The girls had only run dashes and relays

before, but this year also competed in the high jump and broad jump.

The highlight of the day's activity came at the end of the meet when Col. Roy Tweedie, commander of Oxnard Air Force Base, presented trophies to the top scoring individuals in each class.

The top scorers were Somis School's Auroa Valdez, who swept honors in the girls fifth grade competition with three first places breaking one old record and setting marks in two new events, and Las Posas School's Jim Barnett, who swept to a triple-win in the class D competition and anchored his school's winning relay team in the same division.

Stan Mosley of Mesa School took top honors in class A with two seconds and one third, Fernando Barroso of Somis topped the field in class B with two firsts and a third, Mike Nettleton of Los Altos School took the class C trophy with two firsts, Jeff Ropes of El Rancho School won in the E class with one first and two seconds, and Mike Martin of El Rancho swept class F with two firsts and a second.

In the girls competition, Jackie Arnold of El Rancho took two firsts and a second for the sixth grade trophy, Jan Gill of Los Altos had two firsts for the seventh grade trophy and Barbara Davis of Los Altos copped

the eighth grade honors with a first and a third.

The meet, attended by about 800 competitors and fans, was reported a success by the Rotarians. Admission was free, but the club ran a refreshment concession to raise funds for the Honn Memorial Scholarship Fund and was down to one hot dog at the end of the six-hour meet. The following is a list of Saturday's record breakers and the entire results of the meet. The winning marks listed in all the girls high jump and broad jump events, and in all the events of the boys classes B, C, E and F are new records, as these were first-time events.
